PROVISINAL NOTICE OF RACE

THE INTERNATIONAL OPTIMIST DINGHY ASSOCIATION OF IRELAND

Rules

- 1.1. The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. I.S.A. prescriptions will apply.
- 1.3. I.O.D.A Class Rules will apply

Advertising

- 1.4. Advertising will be restricted to Category A.
- 1.5. All Competitors' Boats may be required to display a Sponsor's logo as instructed. If required, the Logo will be available at registration.

Eligibility and Entry

- 1.6. Competitors must be Members of IODAI or their National Optimist Association
- 1.7. Entry is open to all sailors who are under 15 on the 1st January.
- 1.8. The entry fee for the Senior and Junior Divisions is €130 and €50 for the Regatta fleet)
- 1.9. Entries received after 31st July 2009 are subject to a Late Entry Fee of €20 per sailor and will be accepted at the discretion of the organising authority.

1. Event Description & Venue

- 1.10. The event will comprise two fleets – a Main fleet which will compete for the Junior and Senior Championship, and a Regatta fleet, which will combine coaching and racing.
- 1.11. The event will be held at The Royal St George Yacht Club, Dun Laoghiare, Co. Dublin, who are the organising authority.

2. Divisions & Fleets – *required for Nationals and Open Regatta*

- 1.12. Senior and Junior Divisions
Boats will be divided two divisions with separate starts as follows:
 - Junior Division: Sailors under 12 on the 1st January in the year of the regatta.
 - Senior Division: Sailor over 12 but under 15 on 1st January in the year of the regatta
- 1.13. Gold and Silver Fleets

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Within each division there will be a further split into Gold and Silver Fleets according to the current national rankings as posted on the IODAI website at www.iodai.com . Gold and silver fleets shall have a single start within their division.

1.14. Identification Ribbons

Each boat shall display the ribbons provided at registration as follows:

Division / Fleet	Colour
Senior / Gold	Blue
Senior / Silver	Pink
Junior / Gold	Red
Junior / Silver	Green

Schedule

1.15. Registration/ Measurement Validation shall be on Tuesday 18th August 2009, the day before racing commences from 18.00 to 21.00 and on Wednesday 19th August 2009, from 0830 – 0930 before racing commences.

1.16. Dates of Racing

1.17. Three races are scheduled each day. The Race Officer may, at his discretion, get one race ahead of schedule but shall not sail more than 4 races on any one day.

1.18. The championship will consist of a maximum of 12 races for the national and open championship.

1.19. 4 races shall constitute a series.

1.20. No race shall be started after 3.00pm on the last day.

Measurement

1.21. You are required to have had your spars, foils and sails measured by a qualified measurer.

1.22. Spot checks will be performed on equipment on a random basis prior to, and during the regatta.

Scoring

1.23. When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

1.24. When from four to six races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

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- 1.25. When from seven to nine races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 1.26. When from ten to twelve races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her three worst scores.

Penalty System

- 4.1 Appendix P will apply.

Sailing Instructions & Briefing

- 1.27. The Major Event Sailing Instructions will apply and will be posted on this website in the near future.
- 1.28. Supplementary Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.
- 1.29. There will be a briefing for main fleet competitors at 09.00 on Wed 19th August.
- 1.30.
- 1.31. A Regatta fleet briefing will be held separately at 09.30 on Wed 19th August as indicated on the Official Notice Board.

Safety Checks

- 1.32. Safety checks will be carried out on all boats either in the Dinghy Park, or on the slipway, before launching. Any boat not displaying the appropriate safety check pass symbol for that day will not be permitted to launch.
- 1.33. A list of the mandatory equipment required in each boat, and the processes to be adhered to, is posted on the IODAI and/or this website under Safety Check List.

Support boats

- 1.34. Support boats must register with the organising committee, and nominate each competitor they are supporting.
- 1.35. Support boats may be called upon by the Race Committee and / or Safety Officer to assist with rescue operations.
- 1.36. There will be a briefing for support boat skippers at 08.30 on Wednesday 19th August 2009.

Disclaimer of Liability

- 1.37. Competitors participate in the championship entirely at their own risk (See RRS 4 - Decision to Race). The Organising authority and host clubs will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the trials.

Insurance

- 1.38. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of €1,500,000 or the equivalent per event.

Regatta Fleet Competency

- 1.39. All Regatta Fleet sailors must be competent and capable of sailing a triangular course (with approximately 250m legs) in light to moderate winds.

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Trolleys

- 1.40. All trolleys must be in full working order and marked with current sail number.
- 1.41. All old trolley tags must be removed. New trolley tags issued at Registration must be attached

Catering

- 1.42. All competitors are to bring their own packed lunch each day in a waterproof lunch bag, or suitable plastic container, clearly marked with their sail number.
- 1.43. A small meal will be provided for all sailors after sailing each day.



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
